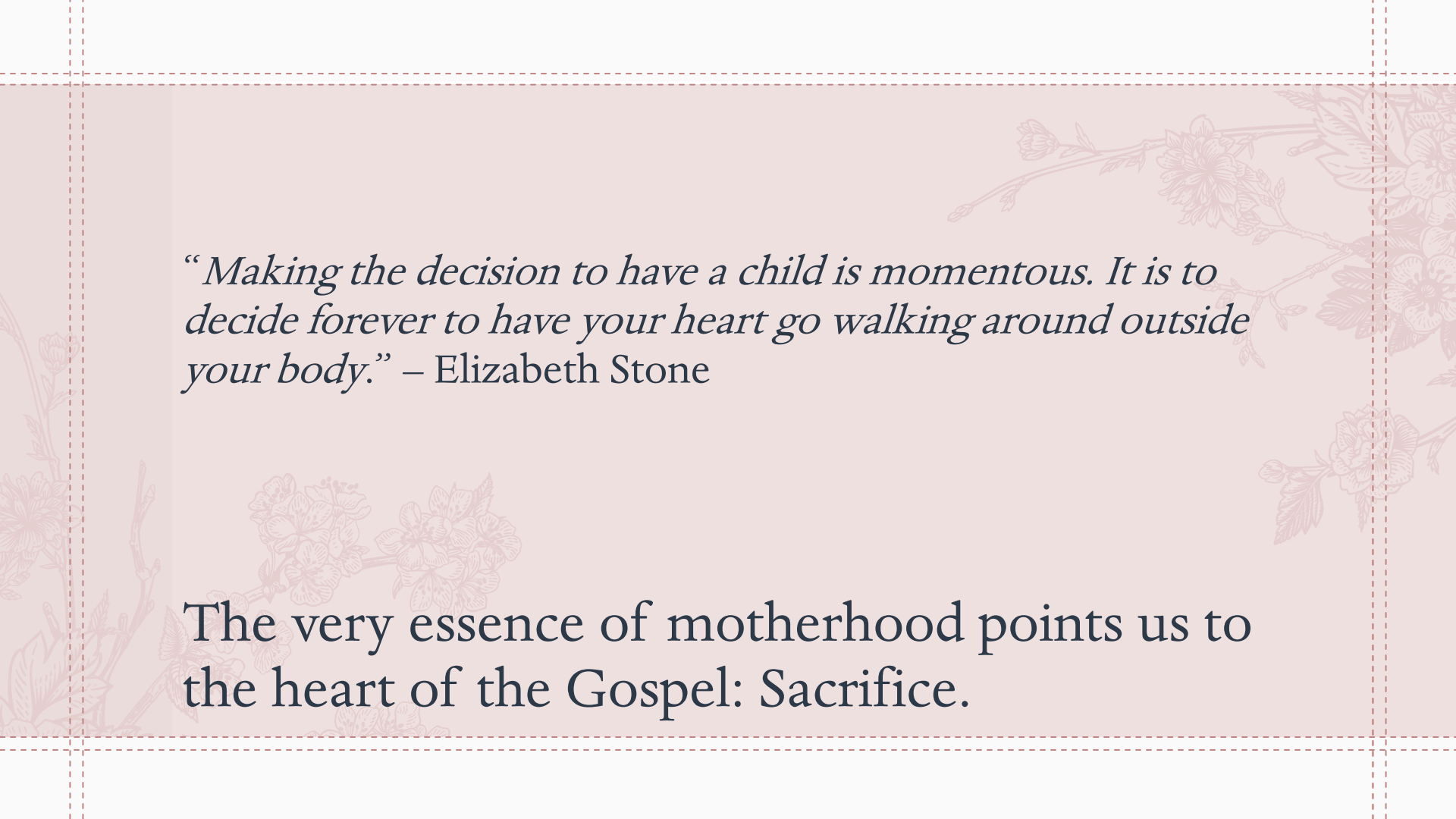
God reveals Himself in Scripture through

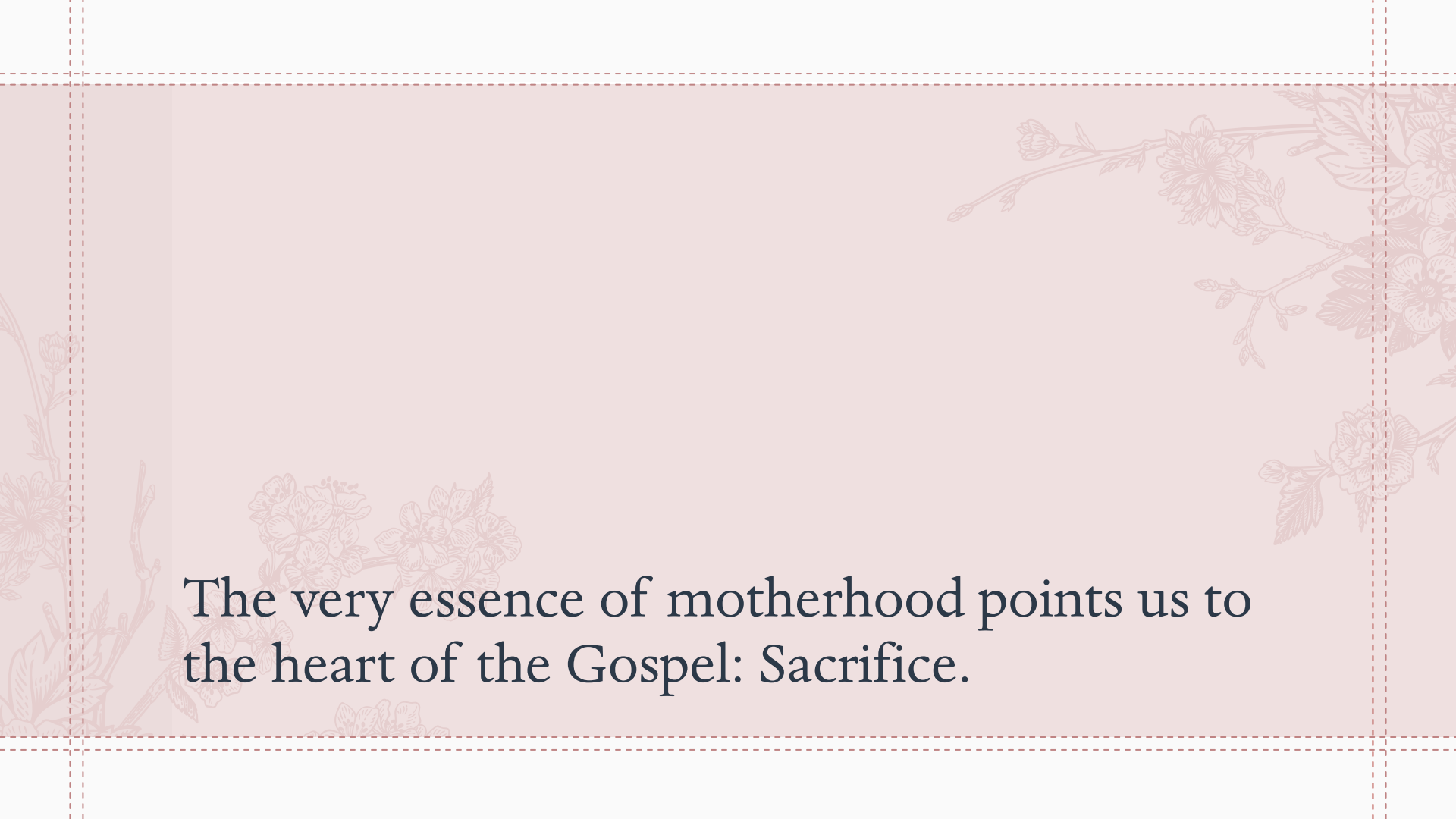


The very essence of motherhood points us to

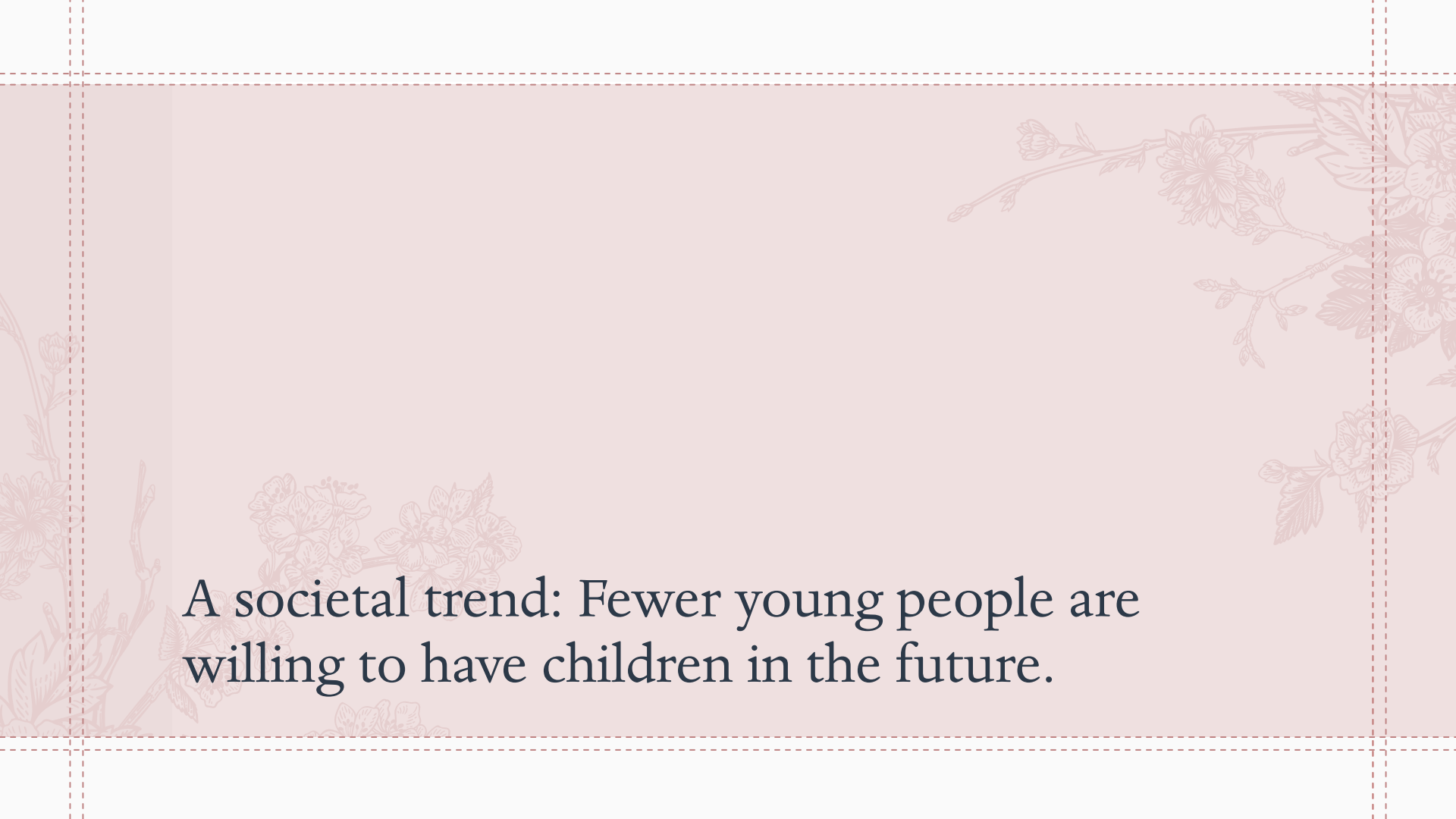


Motherhood and the Gospel have the same
melody: Sacrifice → New Life → Joy

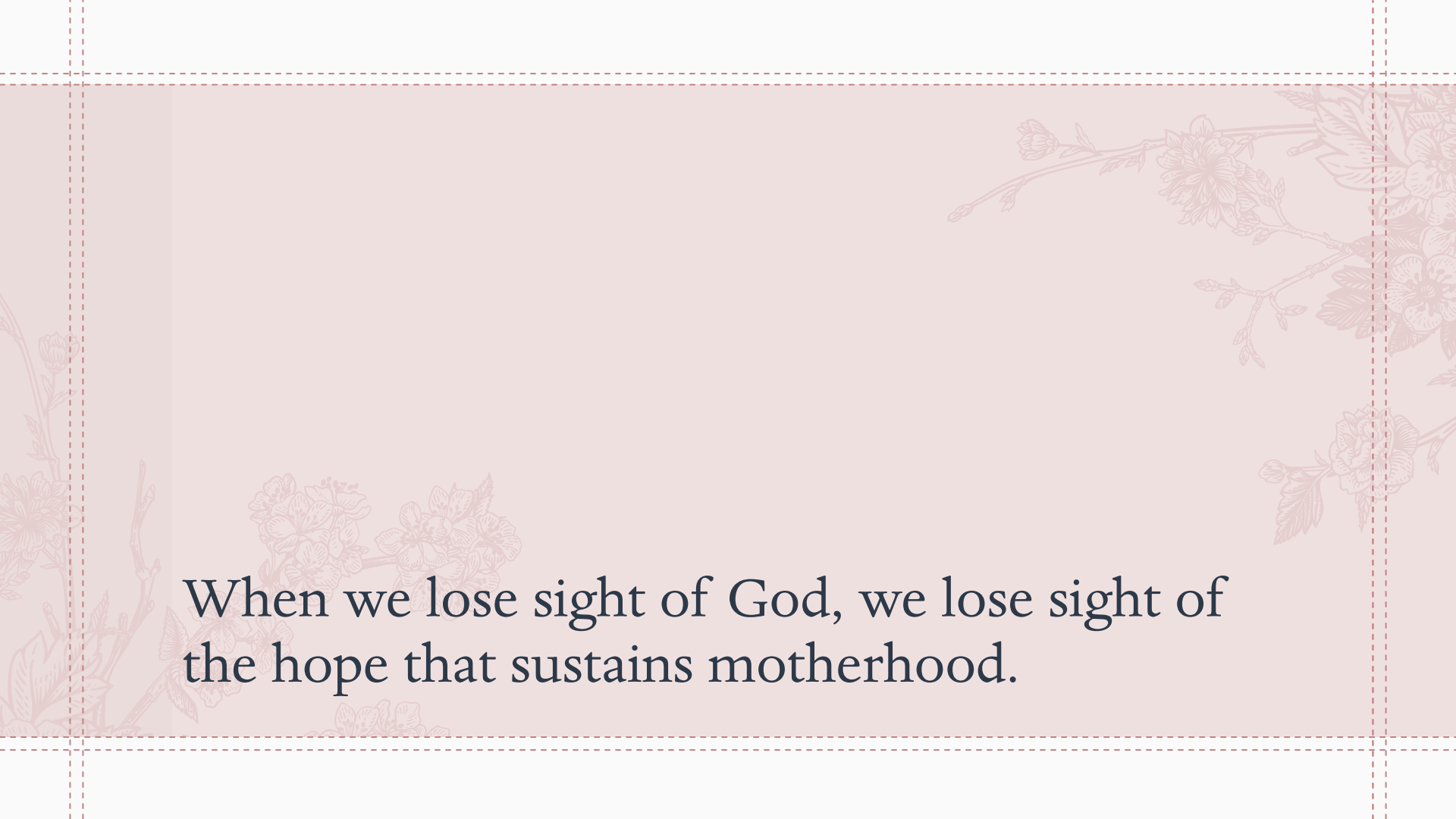

Motherhood gives us an image of love that sacrifices to give life and bring joy.

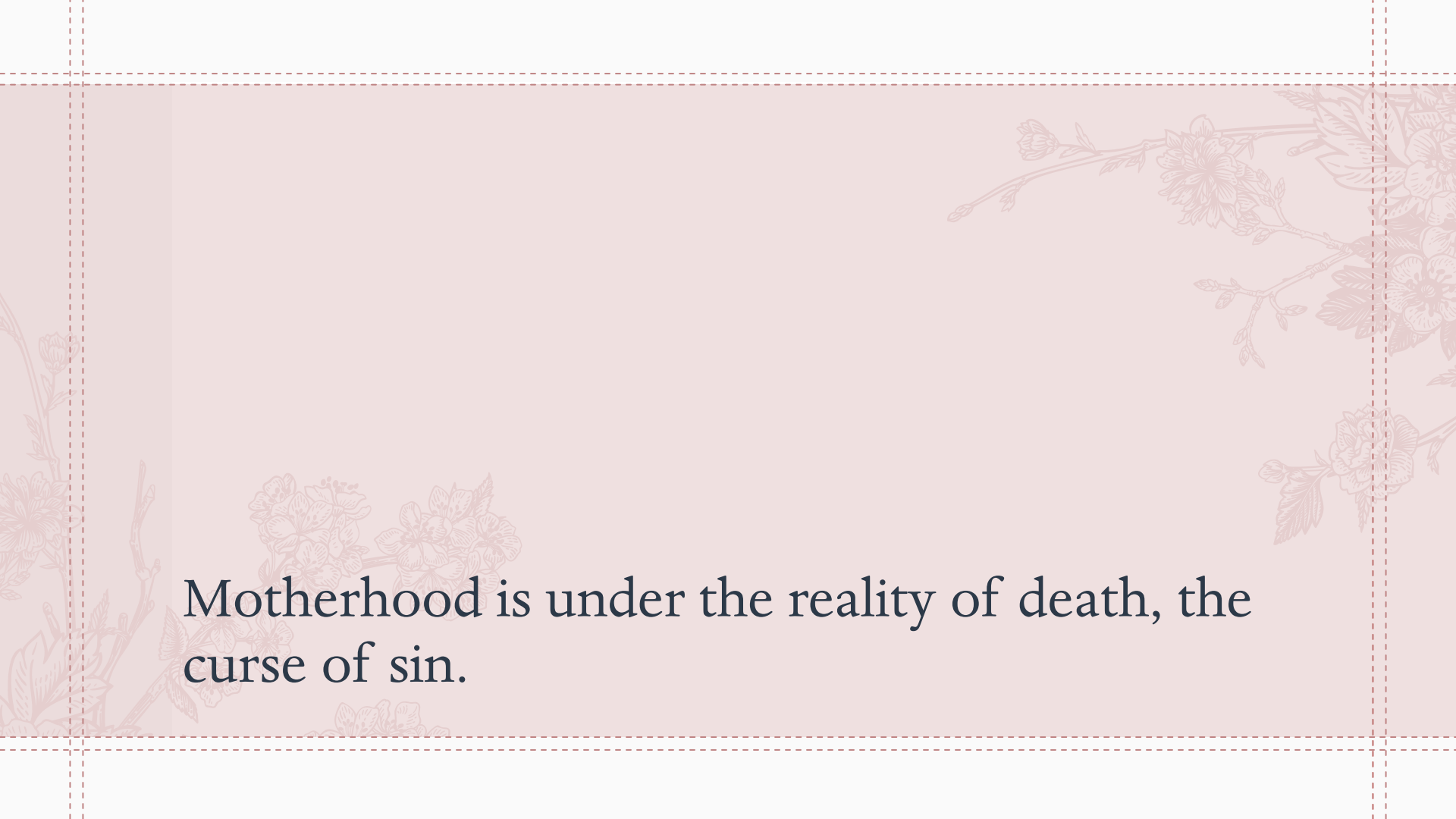
The Gospel fulfills that image: *A Savior who sacrifices not only to give life, but to become life for His people so together they may dwell in joy everlasting.*



A societal trend: Fewer young people are willing to have children in the future.

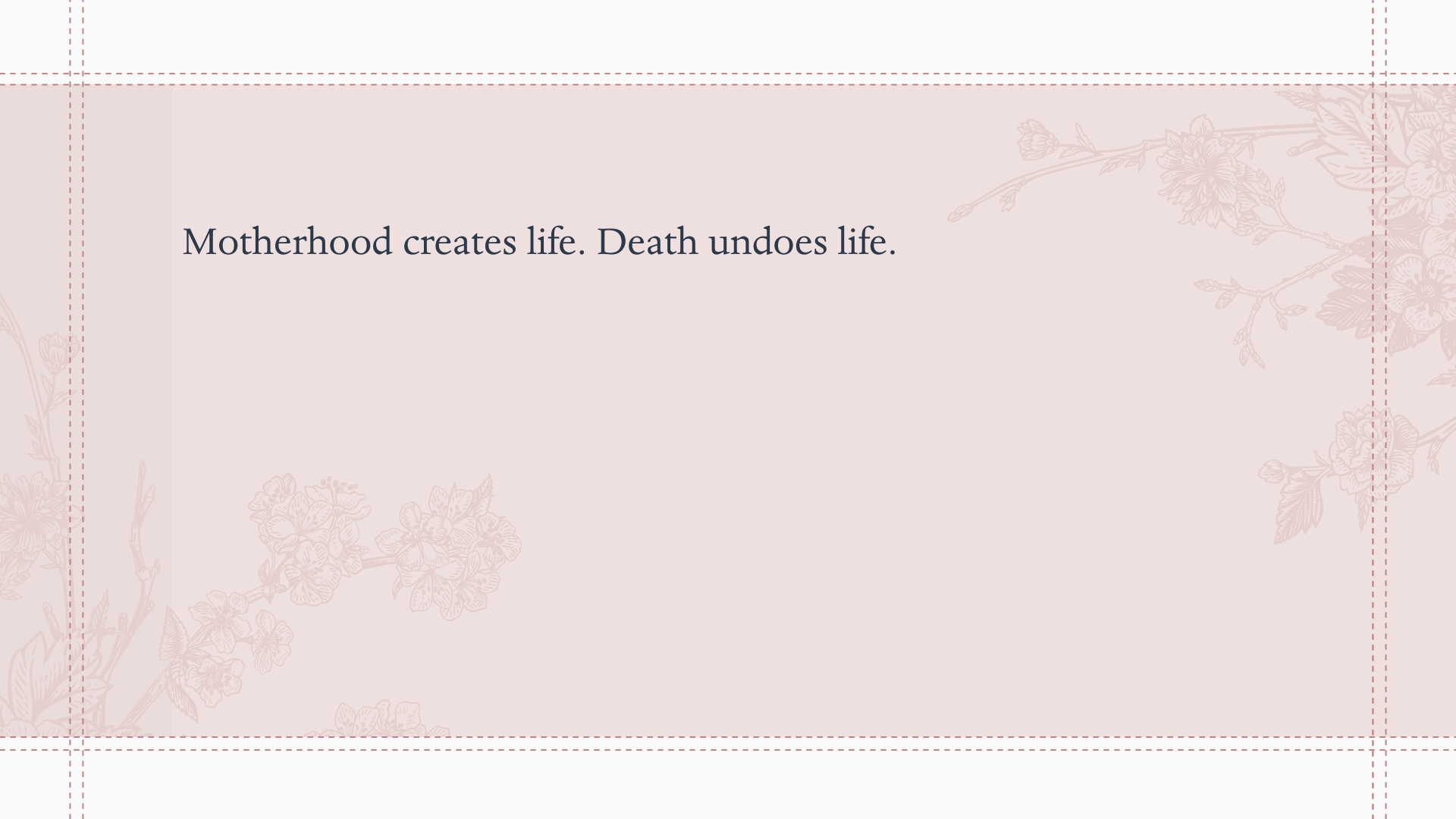


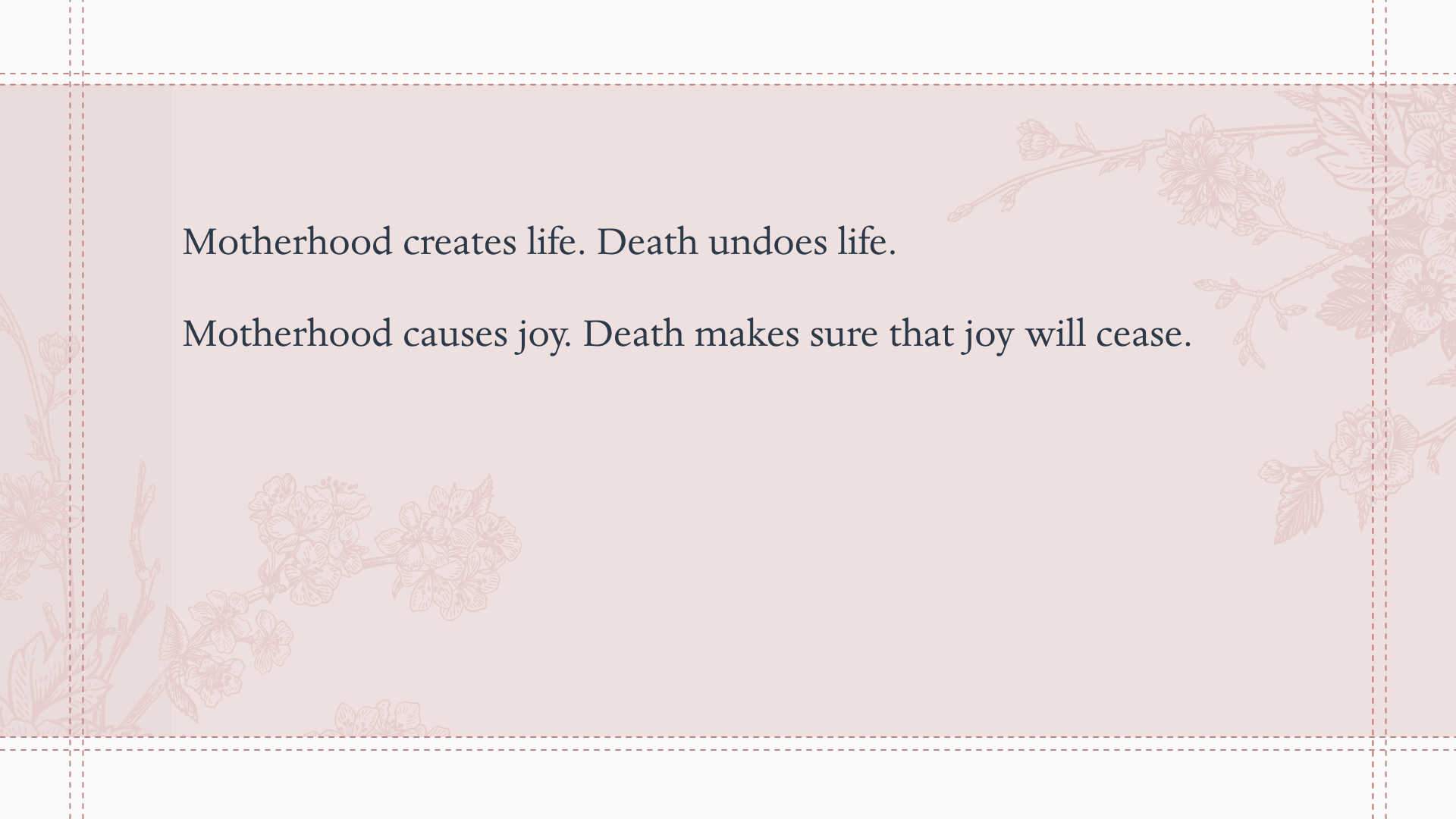

Motherhood causes joy. Death makes sure that joy will cease.

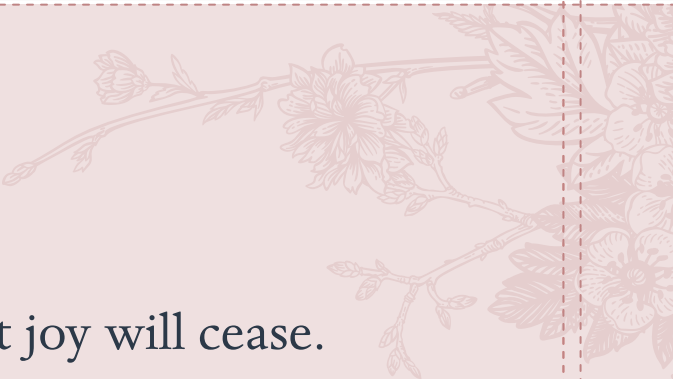


Motherhood creates life. Death undoes life.

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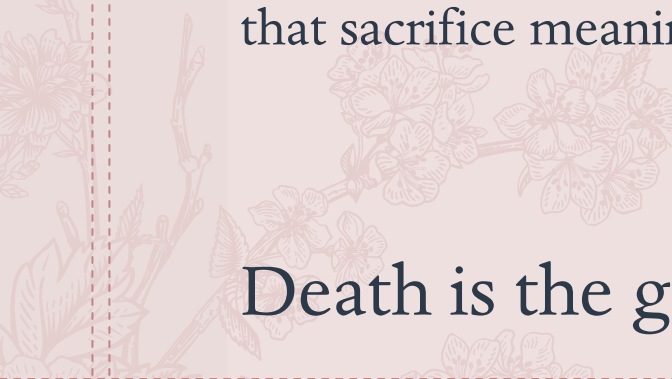
Motherhood calls for loving sacrifice. Death threatens to make that sacrifice meaningless.



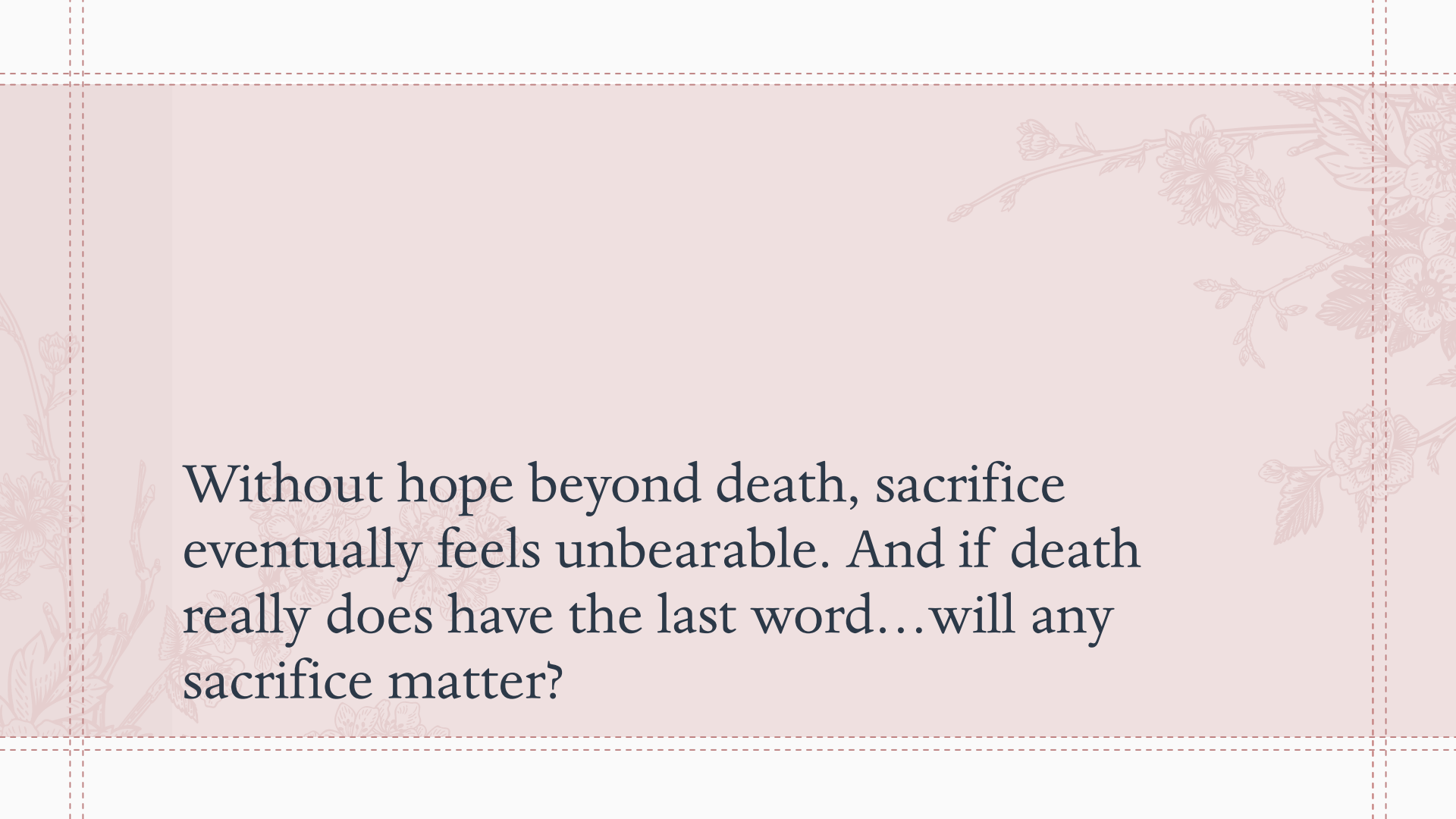
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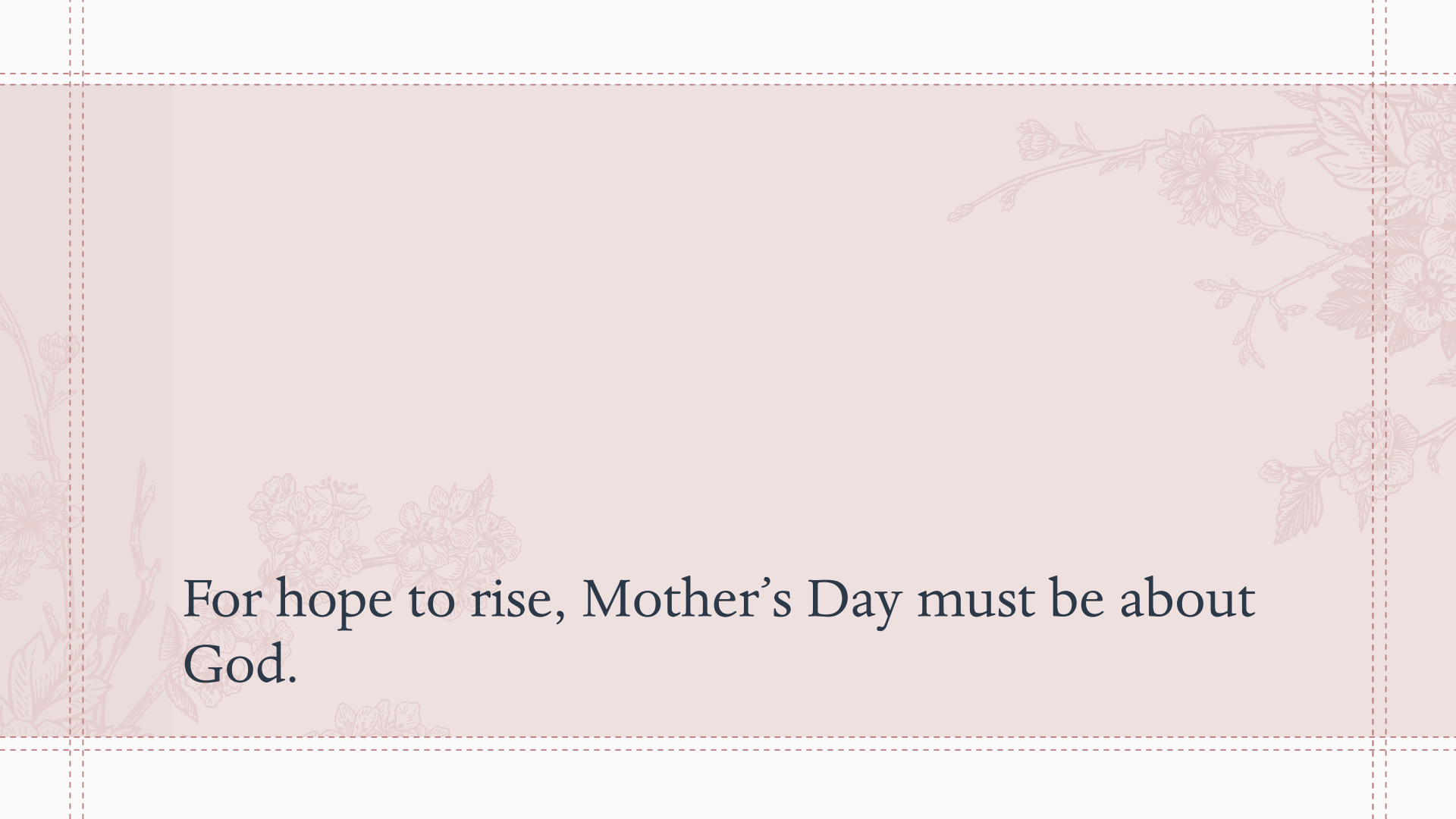
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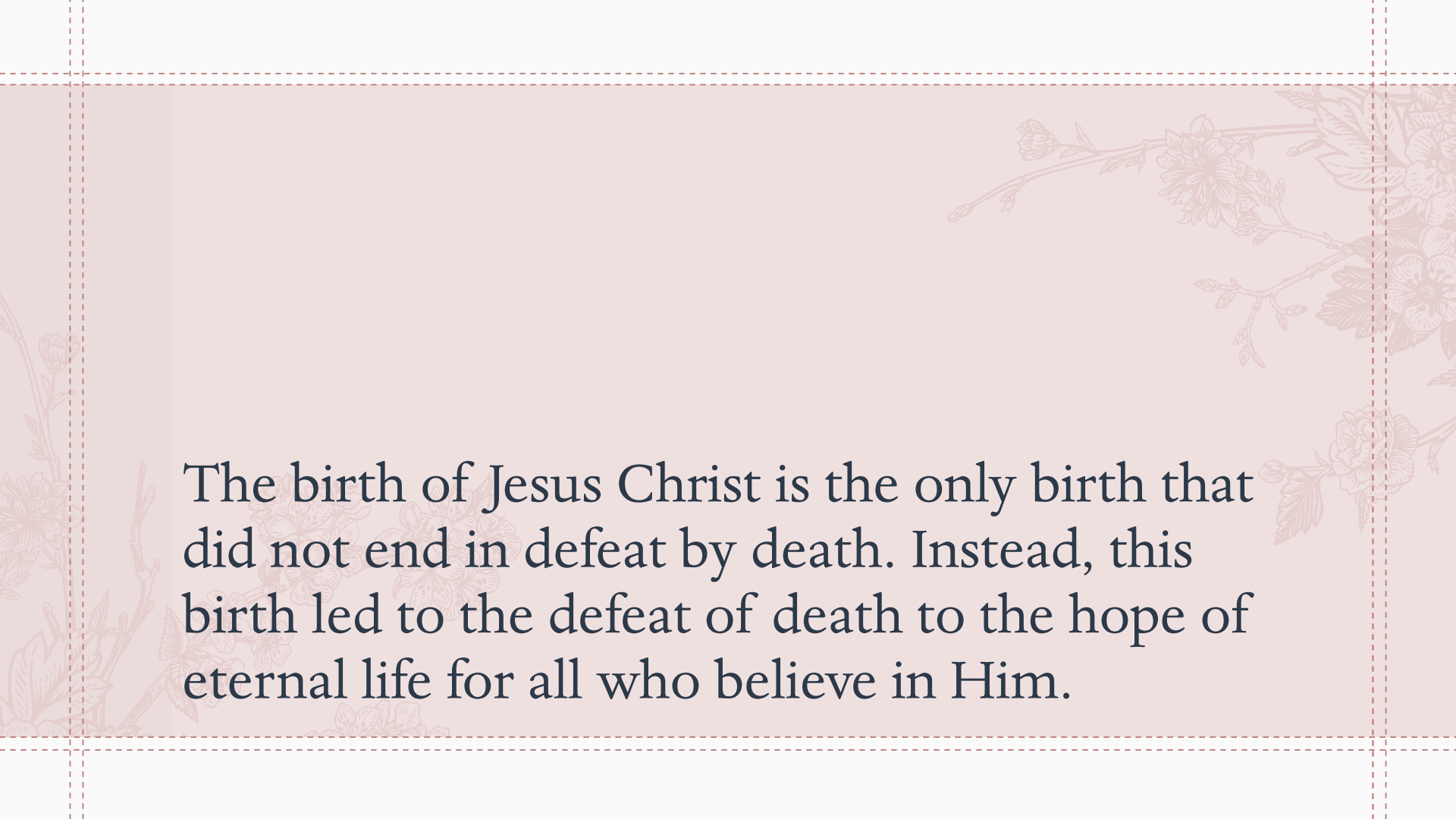
Death is the greatest enemy of motherhood.



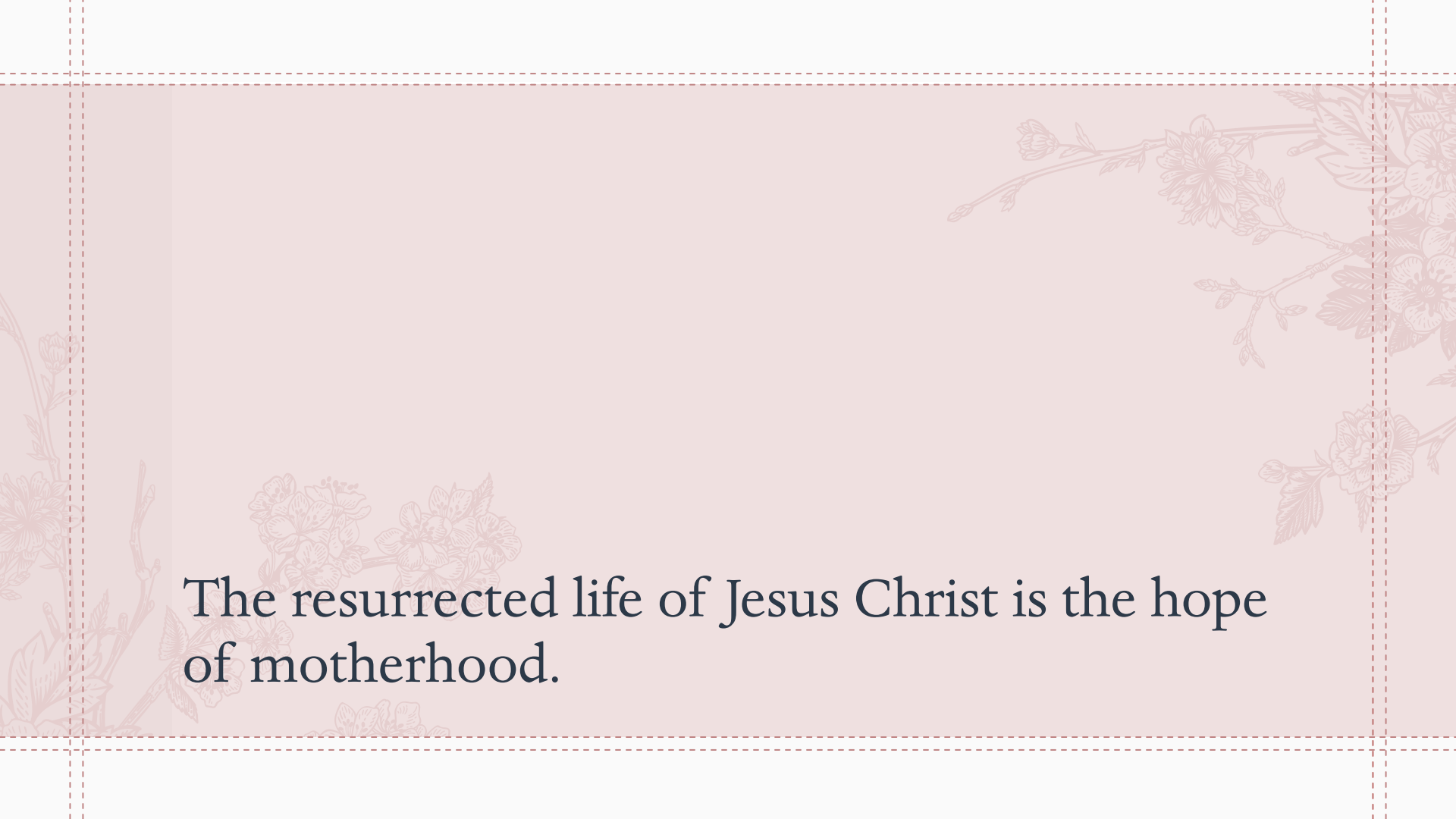
Without hope beyond death, sacrifice eventually feels unbearable. And if death really does have the last word...will any sacrifice matter?



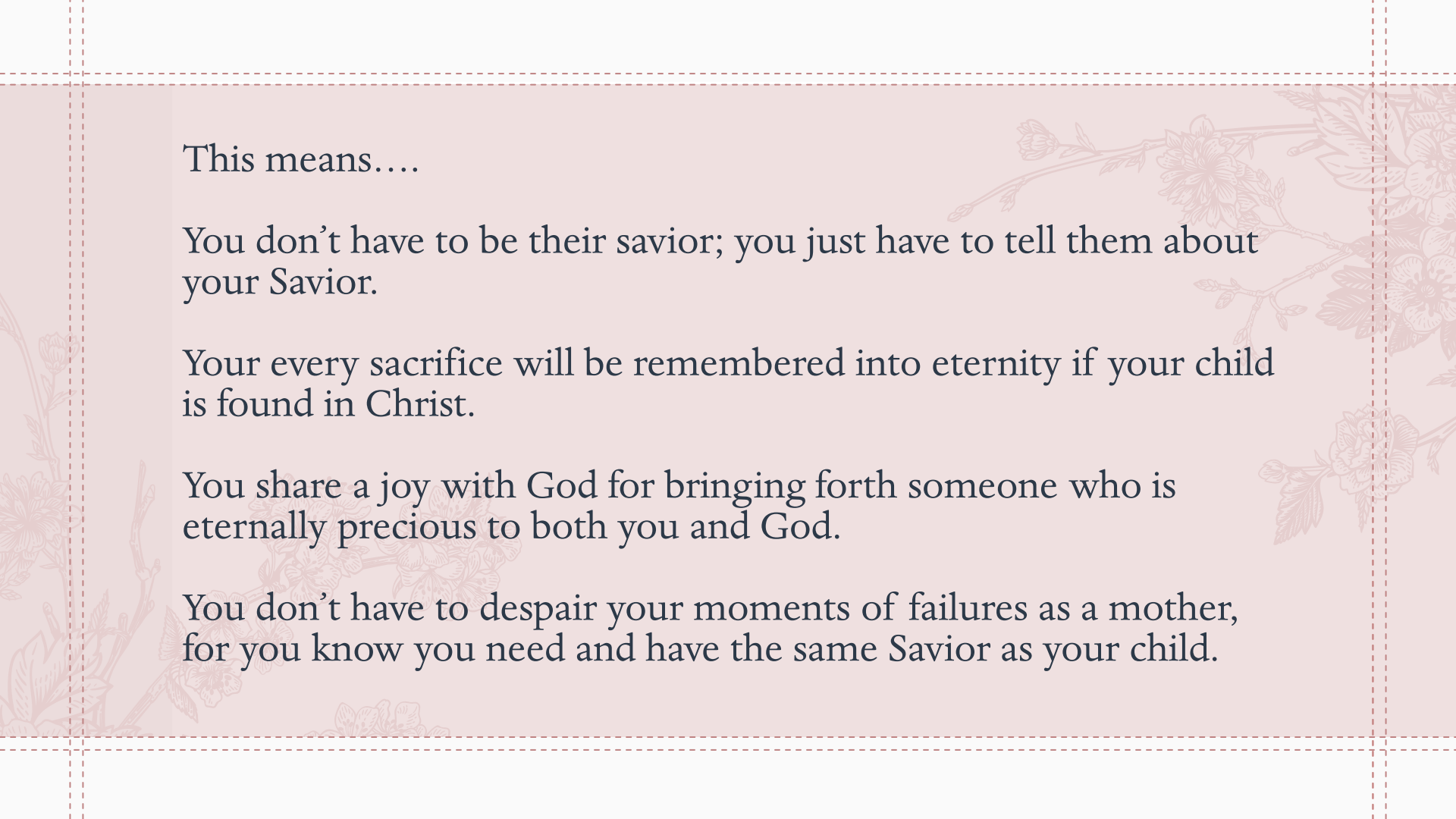
For hope to rise, Mother's Day must be about

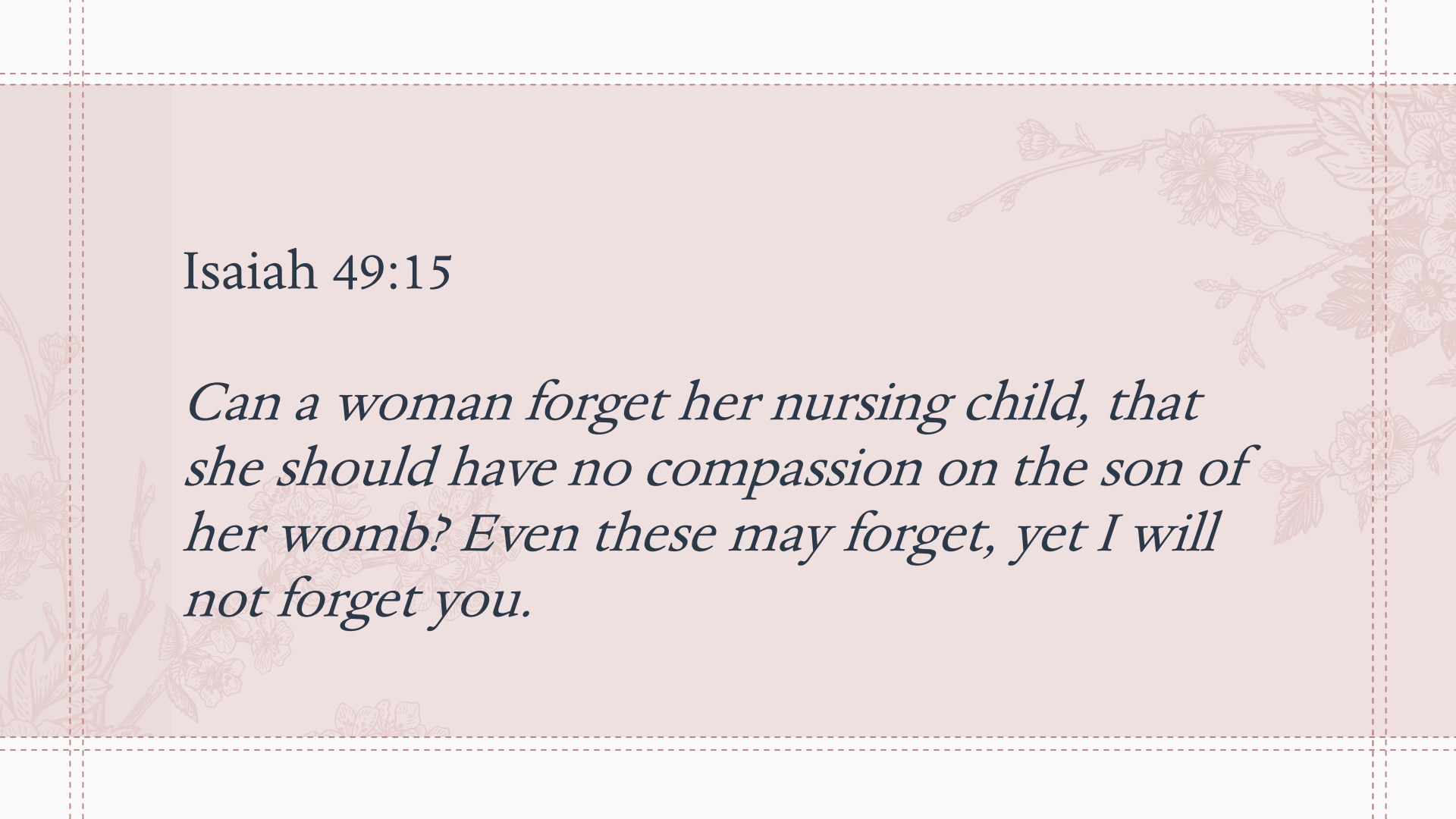
This means....
